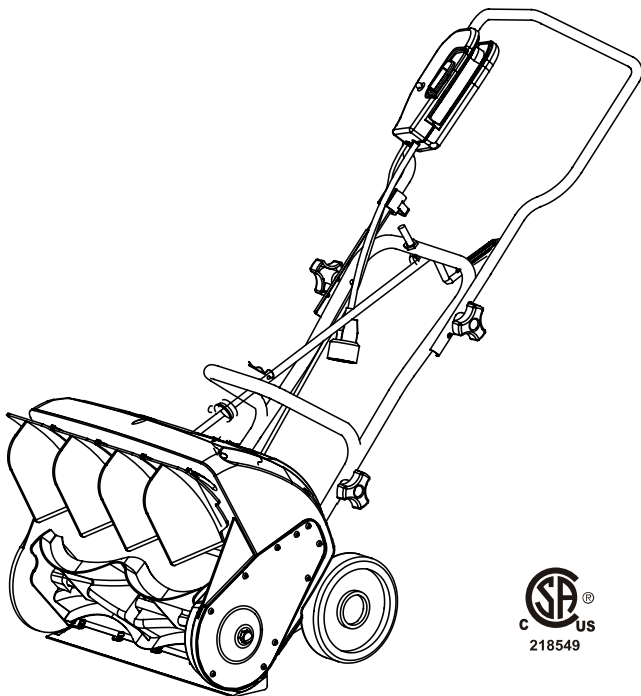

IMPORTANT

READ AND UNDERSTAND ALL INSTRUCTIONS. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire, and/or serious personal injury.

- Walk. Do not run.
- Verify that the Snow Shovel is not in contact with anything before turning it on.
- Stay away from the discharge opening at all times. Keep face, hands, and feet away from concealed, moving, or rotating parts.
- Be attentive when using the Snow Shovel, and stay alert for holes in the terrain and other hidden hazards or traffic.
- Do not use the Snow Shovel on a gravel or crushed rock surface. Use extreme caution when crossing gravel/crushed rock drives, walks, or roads.
- Move up and down slopes when clearing snow. Do not go across a slope. Use caution when changing direction. Do not use this Snow Shovel to clear snow from steep slopes.
- Do not attempt to use the Snow Shovel on a roof or on any steeply inclined slippery surface.
- Do not operate the Snow Shovel if the guards, plates, and other safety protective devices are not in place.
- Do not operate the Snow Shovel near glass enclosures, automobiles, trucks, window wells, drop-offs, etc. without properly adjusting the angle of the snow discharge. Keep children and pets away from the work area.
- Do not force or overload the Snow Shovel. The Snow Shovel will perform better and safer when it is used at the rate that it was designed to work at.
- Do not operate the Snow Shovel at high speeds on slippery surfaces. Look behind, and exercise caution when backing up.
- Do not direct the discharge toward people, and do not allow anyone to move in front of the Snow Shovel while it is in use.
- Wear safety glasses or goggles that meet ANSI Z87.1 standards, and wear ear/hearing protection when using this Snow Shovel.
- Use the Snow Shovel in daylight or in good artificial light.
- Avoid accidental start-ups. Remain in the starting position when turning the Snow Shovel on. The operator and the Snow Shovel must be in a stable position during start-up. See the section entitled Starting/Stopping Instructions.
- Use the proper tool. Only use this Snow Shovel for the purpose that it was designed for.
- Do not overreach. Always keep proper footing and balance.
- Hold the Snow Shovel with both hands while it is in use. Keep a firm grip on the handles or the grips.
- Keep hands, face, and feet away from all moving parts. Do not touch or try to stop the impeller while it is rotating.
- If the impeller does not rotate freely due to frozen ice, thaw the Snow Shovel thoroughly before

- attempting to use it.
- Keep the impeller clear of debris.
- Do not attempt to clear the impeller while the motor is running or while the Snow Shovel is plugged in it. Turn the motor off and unplug the Snow Shovel from the extension cord or the outlet.
- Keep clothing and body parts away from the rotor.
- Do not operate the motor at a faster speed than necessary. Do not run the motor at high speed while not clearing snow.
- Stop the motor when snow clearing is delayed or when moving from one location to another.
- Unplug the Snow Shovel when it is being transported and when it is not in use.
- After striking a foreign object, turn the Snow Shovel off and unplug it, and then inspect it for damage. Repair any damage before restarting and using the Snow Shovel.
- If the Snow Shovel starts to vibrate abnormally, stop the Snow Shovel immediately and attempt to determine the cause. Vibration is generally an indication of danger.
- Stop the motor and unplug the Snow Shovel whenever the operator is not in the operating position, before unclogging the impeller, and before making any repairs, adjustments, or inspections.
- Do not discharge snow onto public roads or near moving traffic.
- Allow the Snow Shovel to run for a few minutes after clearing snow in order to prevent moving parts from freezing.
- Use only the manufacturer's original replacement parts and accessories for this Snow Shovel. The use of unauthorized parts or accessories could lead to serious injury to the user or damage the Snow Shovel, and will void the warranty.
- Do not use the Snow Shovel in the hand held position. Do not pick up the Snow Shovel while it is plugged and running. The Snow Shovel is designed to travel along the ground.









GENERAL SAFETY RULES

- Verify that the Snow Shovel is secure while transporting.

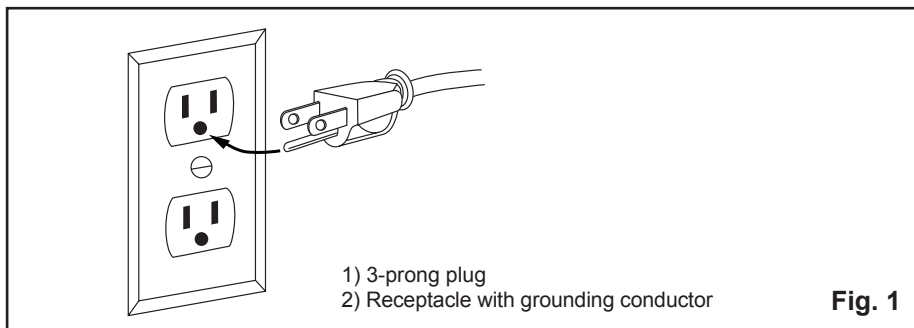
ELECTRICAL INFORMATION (See Figure 1)

⚠ WARNING

To avoid electrical hazards, fire hazards, or damage to the tool, use proper circuit protection. The Snow Shovel is wired at the factory for 120 V operation. Connect to a 120 V, 15 A circuit and use a 15 A time delayed fuse or circuit breaker. To avoid shock or fire when the power cord is worn, cut, or damaged in any way, replace it immediately.

This Snow Shovel has a 3-prong plug that is intended for use on a circuit that has a receptacle like the one illustrated in Fig. 1.

Do not modify the power cord plug. If it does not match the electrical outlet, have the proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.



⚠ WARNING

To avoid injury, when servicing the Snow Shovel, use only identical replacement parts.

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

IN THE EVENT OF A MALFUNCTION OR BREAKDOWN, grounding provides the path of least resistance for electrical current and reduces the risk of electric shock. This tool is equipped with an electric cord that has a POLARIZED plug. The plug **MUST** be plugged into a matching outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with ALL local codes and ordinances.

DO NOT MODIFY THE PLUG PROVIDED. If it will not fit the outlet, have the proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

EXTENSION CORD

⚠ WARNING

In order to reduce the risk of electric shock when operating this Snow Shovel, use only a CSA listed extension cord that is approved for outdoor use, such as Type SJTW, 16AWG, and that has a lower temperature rating of -40° F (-40° C).

ELECTRICAL

- Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI) protection should be provided on the circuit(s) or outlet(s) that will be used for this Snow Shovel. For an extra measure of safety, use a receptacle that has built-in GFCI protection.
- The nameplate on the Snow Shovel indicates the voltage used. Do not connect the Snow Shovel to an AC circuit that provides a different voltage from the voltage that is indicated on the nameplate.

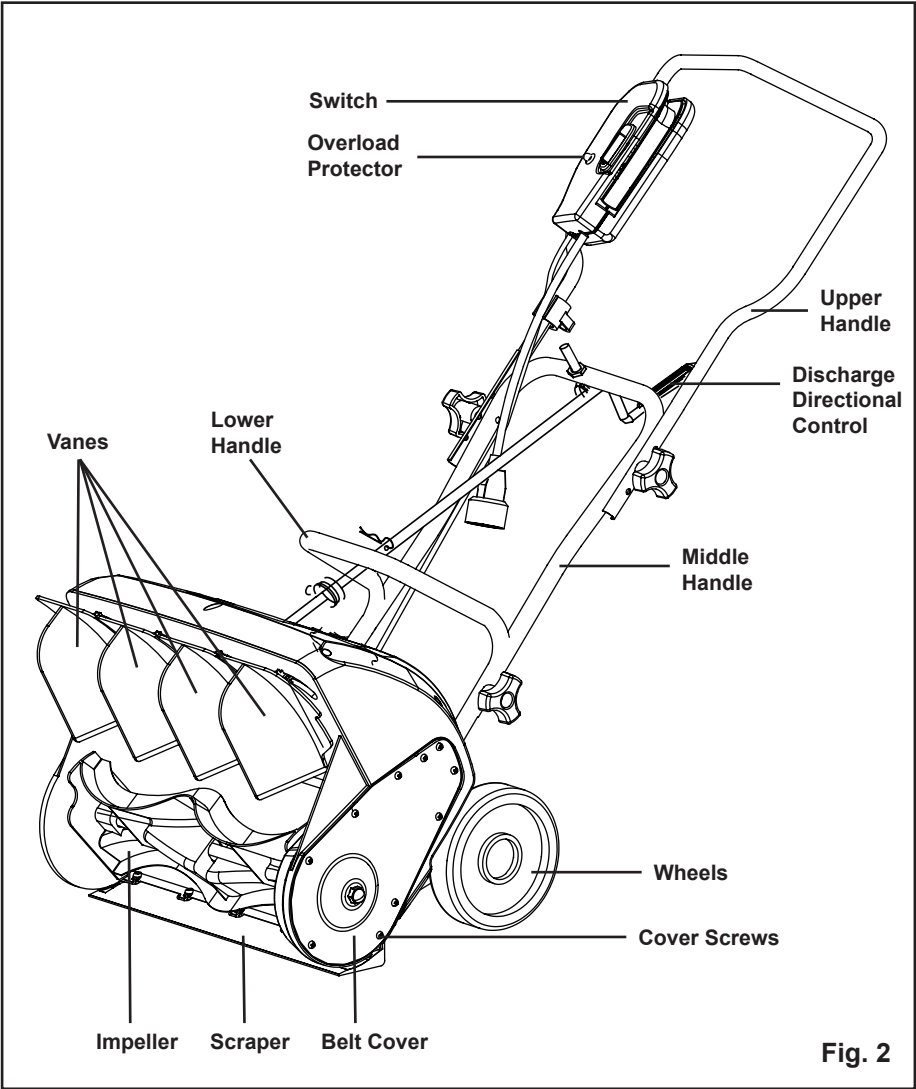
In order to prevent electric shock, use an extension cord that is suitable for outdoor use.

- Inspect the extension cord and the power cord on a regular basis. Look for deterioration, cuts, or cracks in the insulation. Inspect the connections for damage. Repair or replace the extension cord or the power cord if any damage is found.
- Verify that the rotor and all moving parts have come to a complete stop, and disconnect the Snow Shovel from the power supply in order to prevent accidental start-ups before cleaning or performing any inspections or repairs.
- Do not abuse the extension cord. Do not carry the Snow Shovel by the power cord or pull on the cord in order to disconnect it from the receptacle.
- Keep the extension cord away from heat, oil, and sharp edges in order to prevent damage.
- If the extension cord is damaged in any manner while it is plugged in, disconnect it from the outlet immediately.
- Avoid accidental start-ups. Do not carry the Snow Shovel with a finger on the switch while it is plugged in. Verify that the switch is in the "OFF" position before plugging in the Snow Shovel.
- Unplug the Snow Shovel and allow it to cool down before putting it into storage. Store the Snow Shovel indoors.
- Unplug the Snow Shovel when it is not in use and before performing any maintenance or repairs.

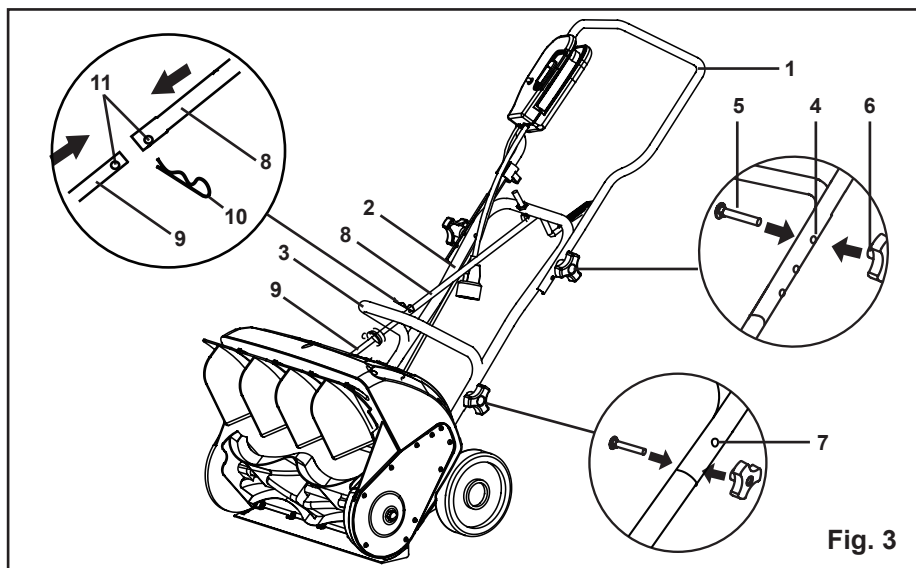

ASSEMBLING THE HANDLE (See Figure 3)

- Remove any packing material that may have been inserted between the upper and lower handles for shipping purposes.
- Align the holes (4) on the upper handle (1) with the holes on the middle handle (2). Insert the bolts (5), and use the wing nuts (6) to tighten them.
- Align the holes (7) on the middle handle (2) and the lower handle (3). Insert the bolts (5), and tighten them using the wing nuts (6) provided.

ASSEMBLING THE DISCHARGE DIRECTIONAL CONTROL (See Figure 3)

- Align the holes (11) on the upper tubing (8) with the holes on the lower tubing (9). Insert the hitch pin (10).



OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

STARTING THE SNOW SHOVEL

WARNING

Avoid accidental start-ups. Verify that the operator is in the starting position when using the snow shovel. In order to avoid serious injury, the operator and unit must be in a stable position when starting the Snow Shovel.

USING THE SWITCH

This Snow Shovel is equipped with a special safety switch. In order to operate the switch, insert one finger into the opening, and push the lever out so that it can be grasped along with the upper handle. Pull the lever back in order to turn the Snow Shovel on, and hold it against the upper handle in order to keep it running. To turn the Snow Shovel off, simply release the lever.

CAUTION

Do not attempt to override the operation of this safety switch.

OVERLOAD PROTECTION SWITCH

This Snow Shovel is equipped with an overload protection switch in order to protect the supply circuit from short circuit overloads. Follow these steps if the switch pops out:

- Release the switch bar, and allow the Snow Shovel to stop and cool down for a minute.
- Press the overload switch in order to reset it. Resume operation (Fig. 2).

Follow these steps if the switch pops out again shortly after the first time:

- Allow the Snow Shovel to stop and cool down for 15 to 30 minutes.
- After the Snow Shovel has cooled down, press the overload switch in order to reset it. Resume operation.

If the overload protection switch does not stay in, or if it continues to pop out during operation, contact the Toll-Free Helpline, at 1-888-909-6757.

USING THE SNOW SHOVEL

- Start the Snow Shovel by following the Starting instructions. The depth and weight of the snow will determine the forward speed.
- Push the Snow Shovel forward so that it rides on the scraper.
- Verify that the power cord is attached to the cord retainer and that it rests on the guide bar. The power cord should trail to the side of the operator.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

ADJUSTING THE DIRECTION OF DISCHARGE (See Figures 4-5)

Snow can be discharged to the left, straight ahead, or to the right of the operator.

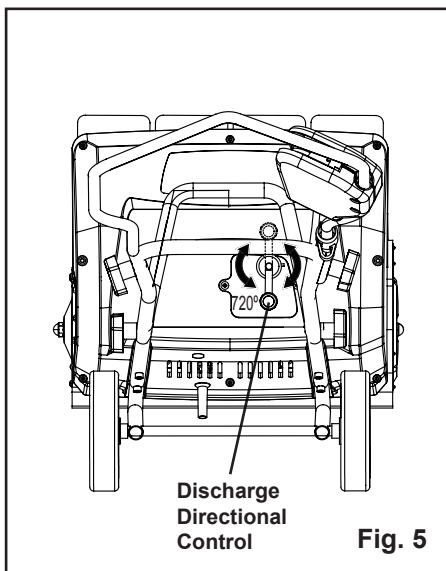
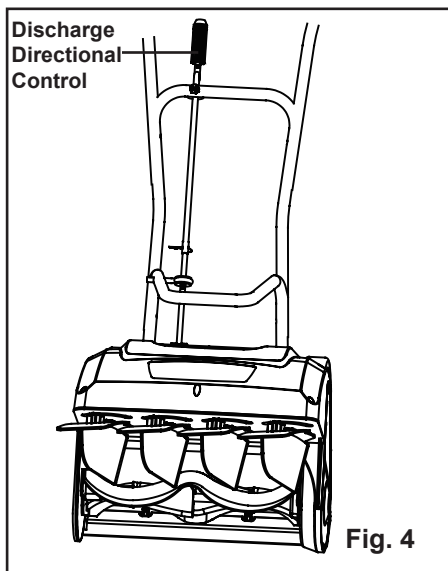
Follow these instructions in order to change the direction of the discharge:

- Release the switch bar in order to stop the rotor.

NOTE: The control stick can revolve 720°.

NOTE: From the center position, the discharge directional control turns approximately 360° in either direction (clockwise or counter-clockwise). Do not force it.

- Turn the discharge directional control clockwise 360°. The vanes will turn approximately 45° to the left.
- Turn the discharge directional control counter-clockwise 360°. The vanes will turn approximately 45° to the right.



TIPS FOR BEST SNOW THROWING RESULTS

- For the most efficient snow throwing, keep the vanes parallel, and throw the snow in the direction of the wind.
- Slightly overlap each swath when clearing snow.

MAINTENANCE

SERVICING

Servicing should be performed by a qualified technician. Replacement parts for this Snow Shovel must be identical to the parts that they replace. If repairs are necessary, contact the Toll-Free Helpline, at 1-888-909-6757.

INSPECTING/REPLACING THE DRIVE BELT (See Figures 6-8)

When servicing the Snow Shovel, use only the manufacturer's original replacement parts. Inspect the drive belt for wear once per year or every 50 hours of operation, whichever comes first. If the drive belt needs to be replaced, follow these steps.

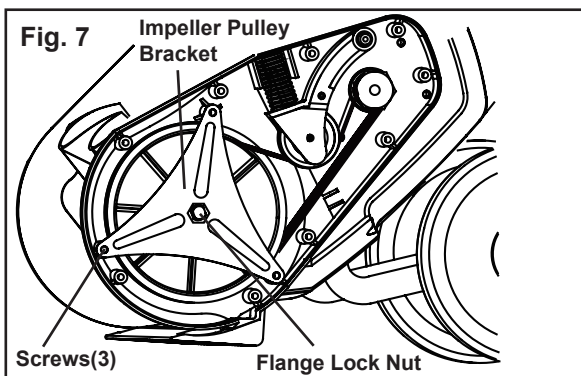
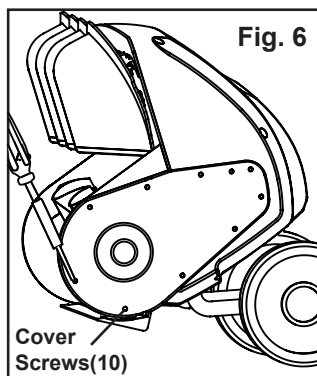
⚠ WARNING

In order to avoid serious personal injury, turn off the Snow Shovel and allow it to cool down. Unplug the Snow Shovel before performing any maintenance.

- Remove the ten (10) screws from the belt cover using a phillips screwdriver (Fig. 6).
- Remove the flange lock nut and the three (3) screws (Fig. 7) .
- Remove the impeller pulley bracket using a washer or nut driver (Fig. 7).

⚠ WARNING

In order to reduce the risk of electric shock, replace the cover before connecting the Snow Shovel to a power source.



- Pull the belt tensioner (idler arm) away from the drive pulley. Remove the damaged or broken belt from the impeller pulley and the drive pulley inside the housing. Discard the belt in the proper manner (Fig. 8).
- Loop the new belt around the drive pulley and the impeller pulley (Fig. 8). Pull the belt tensioner (idler arm) away from the drive pulley in order to install the belt around the drive pulley.

NOTE: Verify that the washer is still in place on the impeller pulley shaft before reinstalling the belt cover.

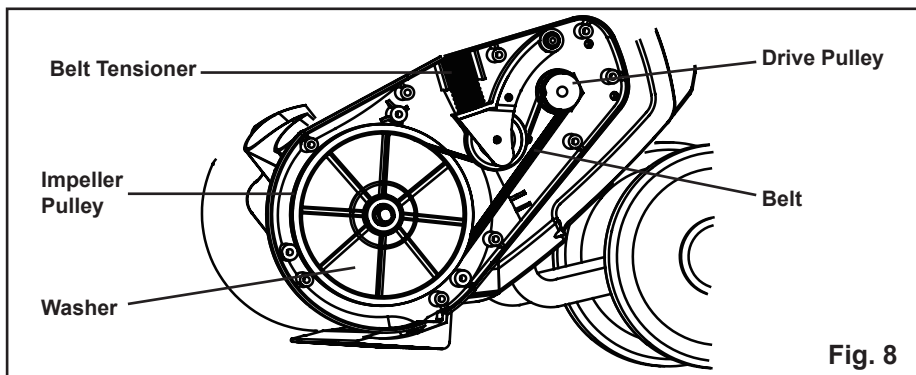
MAINTENANCE

- Reinstall the impeller pulley bracket with the three (3) screws.
- Reinstall the flange lock nut. Tighten the nut.
- Reinstall the belt cover with the ten (10) screws. In order to facilitate the installation, position the narrow part of the cover into the recess of the housing and install the two top screws, and then push the rest of the cover down into the recess and over the rotor shaft. Tighten all ten (10) screws.

NOTE: If the flange lock nut is damaged, do not replace it with a standard nut. Use only the manufacturer's original replacement parts.

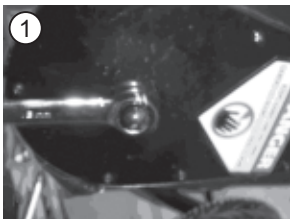

When fitting the belt back into the main housing, verify that the belt is positioned to the right of the Drive Belt Retainer. If the belt is positioned to the left of the Drive Belt Retainer, serious damage may occur.

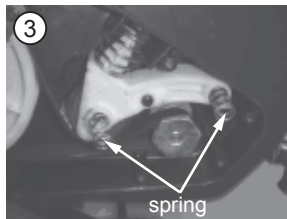
IMPELLOR REPLACEMENT



- Remove the nut from the left hand side of the impellor shaft.



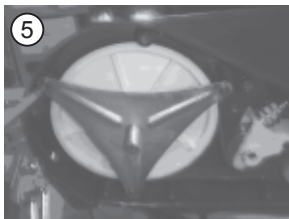
- Remove the 10 screws from the side cover.



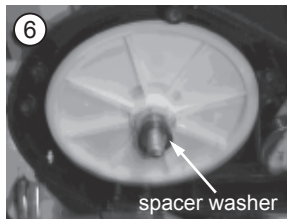
- Be sure not to lose the 2 springs.



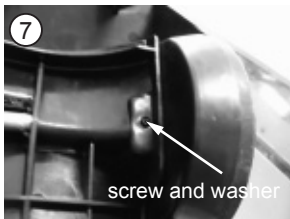
- Remove the nut from the impellor shaft.



- Remove the 3 screws holding the pulley support plate.



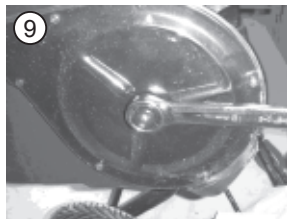
- Remove the plate and the two spacer washers.



- Remove the 2 screws and 2 washers.



- Remove the pulley and belt.



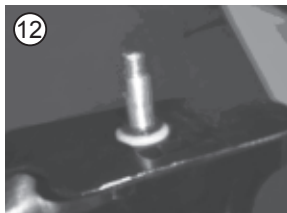
- Remove the impellor shaft nut from the right hand side.



- Withdraw the impellor shaft from the left hand side.



- Withdraw the old/damaged impellor. Be sure to keep the 2 spacer washers from the right hand side of the impellor.



- Insert the impellor shaft in the new impellor and place the 2 washers on the right hand side.

MAINTENANCE

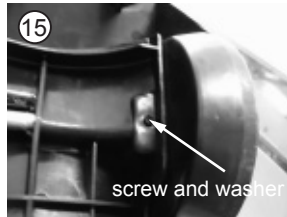
IMPELLOR REPLACEMENT



- Place the impeller and shaft back into the front scoop.



- Place the pulley back onto the impeller shaft.



- Replace the 2 screws and 2 washers onto the impeller.



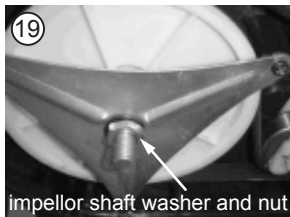
- Be sure to route the belt correctly, as shown.



- Replace the 2 spacer washers on the impeller shaft.



- Replace the pulley support plate and the 3 retaining screws.



- Replace and tighten the impeller shaft washer and nut.



- Place the upper spring into position and then finger tighten the cover plate into place as shown.



- Place the lower spring into position and slide the side cover up using slight pressure to hold the spring in place.



- Replace and tighten the remaining screws and the nut and washer.



- Re-install the impeller shaft nut and washer on the right hand side, and tighten.

MAINTENANCE

REPLACING THE SCRAPER (See Figure 9)

⚠ WARNING

In order to avoid serious personal injury, turn off the Snow Shovel and unplug it before performing any maintenance.

Use only the manufacturer's original replacement parts.

- Place the Snow Shovel on the ground or on a work bench. Position the Snow Shovel so that the impeller is facing up.
- Remove the five (5) screws that are located beneath the impeller that secure the scraper to the housing using a phillips screwdriver (Fig. 9)
- Remove the scraper, and discard it in the proper manner.
- Snap the new scraper into position, and attach it to the Snow Shovel by reinstalling the five (5) screws. Tighten the screws.

STORAGE

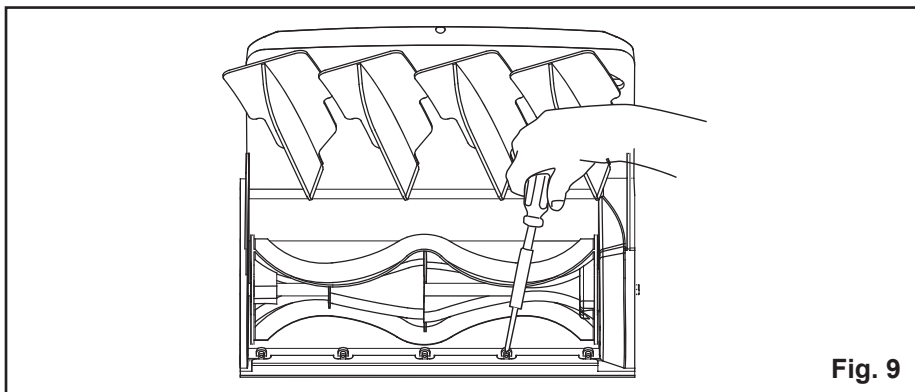
- Allow the motor to cool down before storing.
- Store the Snow Shovel in a locked location in order to prevent unauthorized use or damage.
- Store the Snow Shovel in a dry, well-ventilated area.
- Store the Snow Shovel out of the reach of children.

CLEANING

⚠ WARNING

In order to avoid serious personal injury, turn off the Snow Shovel and unplug it before cleaning or servicing.

Use a small brush to clean the outside of the Snow Shovel. Do not use strong detergents. Household cleaners that contain aromatic oils such as pine and lemon, and solvents such as kerosene can damage the plastic housing and handles. Wipe off any moisture using a soft cloth.



MAINTENANCE

TRANSPORTING THE SNOW SHOVEL *(See Figure 10)*

- Allow the motor to cool down before transporting.
- Secure the Snow Shovel while transporting.
- When moving the Snow Shovel, grasp it by the top and bottom handles (Fig. 10).
- When transporting the Snow Shovel with the handles folded, be careful not to make contact with the discharge directional control and accidentally bend it. If the control is bent or damaged, it will not be possible to adjust the vanes.

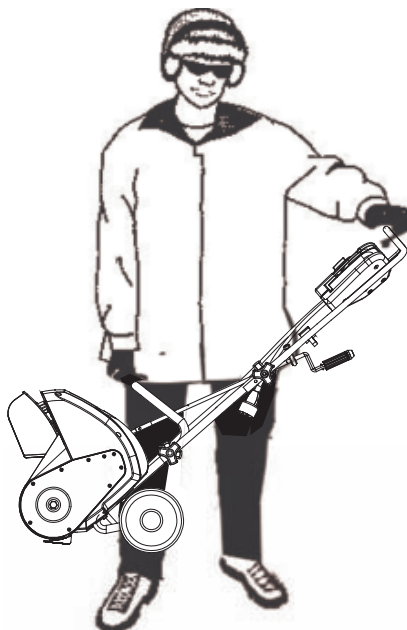

TROUBLESHOOTING

The handle is not in position.	The carriage bolts are not properly seated.	Adjust the height of the handle, and verify that the carriage bolts are properly seated. Tighten the knobs.
The Snow Shovel does not start.	The Snow Shovel is unplugged.	Verify that the Snow Shovel is plugged into an electrical outlet.
	The lock-out button or trigger switch were not used properly.	Press and hold the lock-out button, and then lift and hold the trigger switch (see the section entitled Starting the Snow Shovel).
	The overload protection switch has popped out.	See the section entitled Overload Protection Switch.
The motor is on, but the rotor does not turn.	The belt is damaged.	Replace the belt (see the section entitled Inspecting/Replacing the Drive Belt).
The Snow Shovel leaves a thin layer of snow behind.	The scraper is worn.	Replace the scraper (see the section entitled Replacing the Scraper).

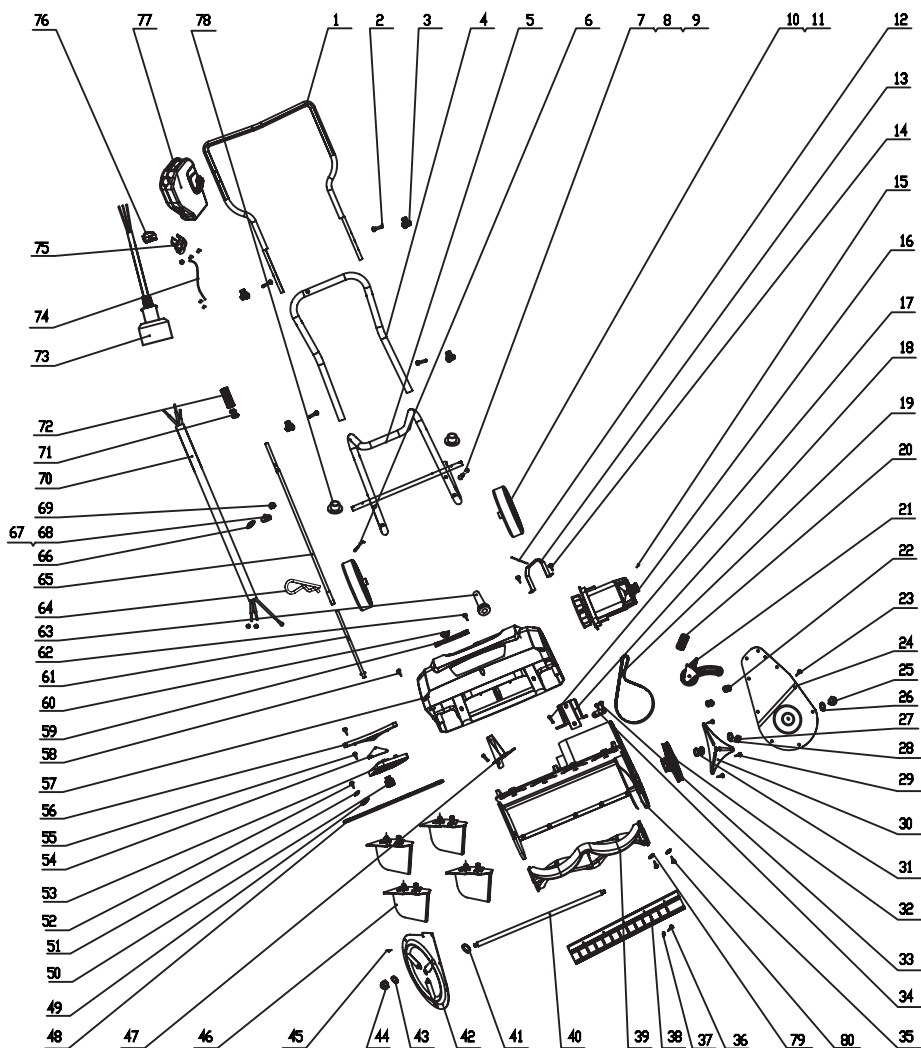
